A. THE FIG TREE (Mark 11:12-14)

- 1. "Jesus was hungry" -
- 2. "a fig tree in leaf"-
- 3. "found nothing but leaves" -
- 4. "May no one ever eat fruit of you again." WHY?
 - a. The fig tree is often used to symbolize the nation of Israel.
 - b. Jesus is using the fig tree as an object lesson teach a truth using common

B. THE TEMPLE (*Mark 11:15-19*)

a. "Jesus entered the temple area" -

THE SET UP

- 1. The vendors split the profits with the priests.
- 2. People needed to purchase a lamb for sacrifice that would sell at ten times the actual price. Potentially up to 250,000 lambs were sold.
- 3. Travelers had to exchange their money for temple currency with a high temple tax that was nothing other than extortion.
 - "began driving out" –

- "overturned the tables" –
- "would not allow anyone to carry-
- b. "and He taught them" -
 - "my house is a house of prayer" -
 - "for all nations" -
 - "a den of robbers" -
- c. "the chief priests and teachers"
 - "looking for a way to kill Him" -
 - "for they feared Him" -

C. THE LESSON (Mark 11:20-21)

- 1. "fig tree withered from the roots" -
- 2. "the fig tree you cursed" -
